### The First Day

 4 core subjects: English, History, Biology, and Math.

# FC Honors Diploma

Academic Honors Diploma plus 12 Pre-AP or AP courses

# Academic Honors Diploma

Prepares students for four-year colleges and allows students to take college-level courses.



# Technical Honors Diploma

Rigorous courses and the opportunity to specialize in business or technical courses.



#### Core 40

Prepares students for two-year and some four-year post-secondary options

#### Credits: 11-22-33

- Students earn one credit each semester for every class they pass.
- Minimum credits needed:
  - Freshman year = 11 credits
  - Sophomore year = 22 credits
  - Junior year = 33 credits
  - Senior year = 43 credits

#### Freshman Classes

- English 9 or English 9 Pre-AP
- Biology or Biology Pre-AP
- 3. Geography & History of the World or Geography & History of the World Pre-AP
- 4. Math Course (based on 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Math Class)
- 5. Recommended: Physical Education and/or Preparing for College and Careers

# College-Bound vs. Pre-AP Courses

Pre-AP courses are more rigorous and prepare students to take college-level courses while at FCHS.

Pre-AP courses may have summer assignments.

### AP - The Basics

- Advanced Placement Program<sup>®</sup> (AP<sup>®</sup>) courses are college-level courses offered in high school. AP courses reflect what is taught in top introductory college courses
- At the end of course, students take AP Exams standardized exams that measure how well students have mastered college-level course work.
- Students who do well on AP Exams can earn credit and/or placement into advanced courses in college.

#### Electives

- Elective courses are available in the following departments:
  - Business
  - Family and Consumer Science
  - Speech, Mass Media and
     World Languages Journalism

- Performing and Visual Arts
- Technology Education
- Project Lead the Way

### Foreign Language

- Three years of one foreign language or two years of one language and two of another are required for the Academic Honors Diploma.
- No foreign language is required for the Core 40 Diploma, but most four year colleges want students to take at least two years.
- Rigorous courses!
